Eden returns to tackle

GYPTIAN commandos attacked United Nations forces last night and British soldiers this morning. Two Egyptians were killed and 15 people, including a British officer, wounded.

There were five attacks in 24 hours on the withdrawing British forces and the Anglo-French commander, Lieut.-Gen. Sir Hugh Stockwell, told a Press conference: "This is exactly the type of incident I expect."


