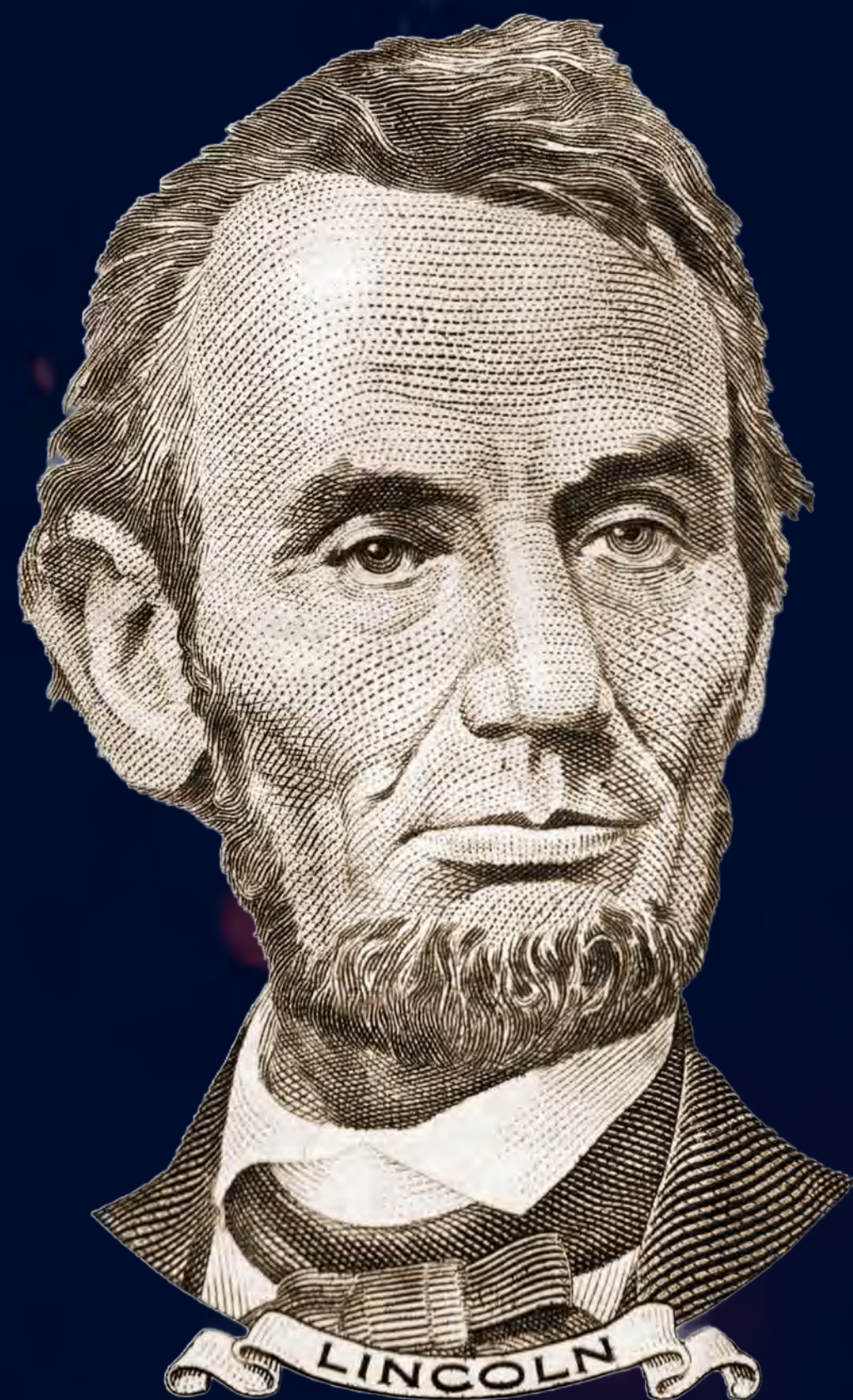

Burns protests at raids on his patrols

EGYPTIANS ATTACK U.N. AND BRITISH TROOPS

Eden returns to tackle Suez problems

PORT SAID, Saturday
EGYPTIAN commandos attacked United Nations forces last night and British soldiers this morning. Two Egyptians were killed and 15 people, including a British officer, wounded.

There were five attacks in 24 hours on the withdrawing British forces and the Anglo-French commander, Lieut.-Gen. Sir Hugh Stockwell, told a Press conference: "This is exactly the type of incident I expect."

Major-Gen. E. L. M. Burns, commander of the United Nations Emergency Force in Egypt, made the strongest protest to the Egyptian authorities against last night's attacks on Norwegian and Swedish patrols of his force.

Four rockets were fired at the headquarters of a Royal Tank Regiment squadron before dawn. Three more attacks with rifles and grenades followed. An Egyptian was killed.

Exchange of fire

Other attacks were made during the night on men of the Royal Scots, who were patrolling the Arab town.

One Egyptian was killed during an exchange of fire and six grenades and sten-gun fire were directed at patrols.

The Egyptian attackers are believed to have been organised by commando leaders sent to Port Said, mostly by fishing boats, to direct underground operations against the withdrawing Allied forces.

The Egyptian Government disclaimed all knowledge of the attacks against U.N. force and said responsibility lay with the U.N. force and that order was still in British hands.

British troops arrested all males over 15 for questioning.

GOVT. SAYS PRICE CURBS MAY YET BE ON WAY

KUALA LUMPUR, Saturday.
THE Federation Government indicated tonight that price controls are still on the cards.

The Assistant Minister for Commerce and Industry, Inche Mohamed Khir bin Johari, said that ideas of controls on essential goods and foodstuffs have not yet been abandoned.

Leading merchants in the Federation, representing chambers of commerce throughout the country, told the government yesterday that recent rises in the prices of certain goods and foodstuffs were "fully justified."

The Department of Commerce issued a statement after a meeting between Government officials and trade representatives.

The meeting with importers was "a necessary starting point in tracing the reasons for any recent price increases," the statement said.

"Ultimately," adds the statement, "the prices with which the public are concerned are those charged by the retailers and further investigations on this matter are proceeding."

Lee: Loan hopes pinned on Britain

LONDON, Sat. — The Federation Minister for Finance, Col. H. S. Lee, today told British journalists that the money he seeks for Malaya's five-year development plan—a thousand million dollars—is the latest estimate—must come partly from abroad.

"The British have been our friends so long," he said, "that I hope they can help us."

He added that approaches to other foreign governments would not be made until Britain had given the answer to requests for help.

In-between figure

The World Bank estimate of \$775 million was too little. The report did not take into account the speed of independence.

Since the report, the Federation Ministers had reckoned that they would need double that sum. But eventually, they had settled for something between those two figures.

Col. Lee told newsmen about the enormous cost of the Emergency and emphasised that Malaya had played fair with Britain over the expenditure of hard currency earnings.

But one thing he refused to do—reveal just how much Malaya is seeking in London.

Health balance

Mr. Oscar Spencer, economic adviser, and Inche Abdul Aziz, representing the Rulers, arrived in London this morning.

Their plane had to turn back to Istanbul with engine trouble.

But Mr. Spencer was up early to be present at the conference.

He said Malaya's trade balance was so healthy that he did not expect any foreign exchange difficulties after independence.

"The wise men from the East," as this week's New Statesman describes the two Chief Ministers, met tonight at a reception given by the Commissioner for Malaya, Inche Othman.

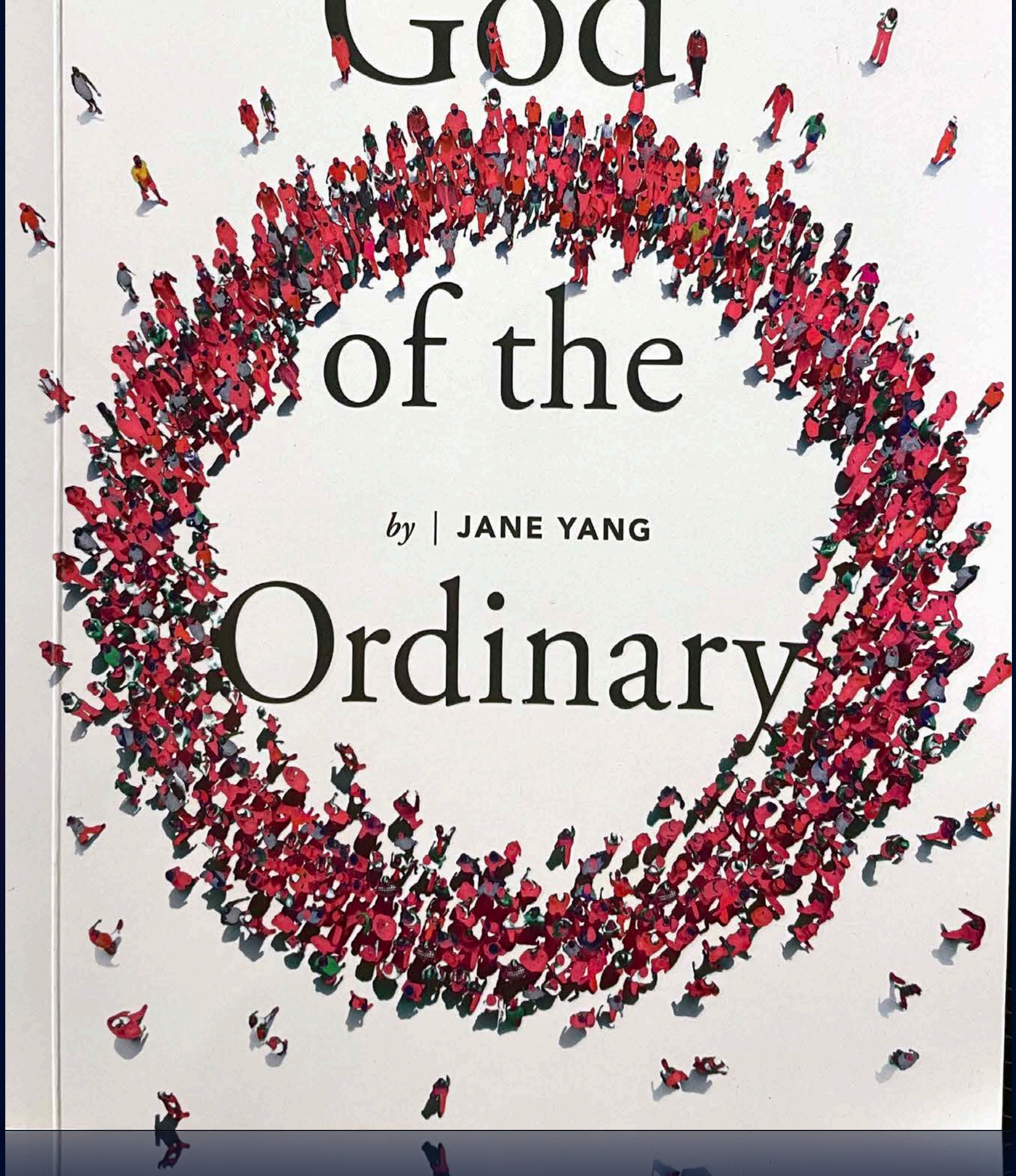
