Ephesians 4:29-30

30 And do not grieve the Holy Spirit of God, by whom you were sealed for the day of redemption.

Colossians 4:6 Let your speech always be with grace, seasoned with salt, that you may know how you ought to answer each one.

A. The Word of God(1) Establish our foundation on the Word of God

A. The Word of God(2) Develop our faith

2 Corinthians 4:13 And since we have the same spirit of faith, according to what is written, "I believe and therefore I spoke," we also believe and therefore speak.

This is how we build Faith Convictions

A. The Word of God(3) Speak the Word

1 Peter 4:10-11
10 As each one has received a gift, minister it to one another, as good stewards of the manifold grace of God. 11 If anyone
speaks, let him speak as the oracles of God. If anyone
ministers, let him do it as with the ability which God supplies, ... A. The Word of God(3) Speak the Word

Philippians 4:8 Finally, brethren, whatever things are **true**, whatever things are **noble**, whatever things are **just**, whatever things are **pure**, whatever things are **lovely**, whatever things are of **good report**, if there is any **virtue** and if there is anything **praiseworthy**—meditate on these things.

B. The Holy Spirit

B. The Holy Spirit(1) Be familiar with His guidance

Hebrews 8:10 For this is the covenant that I will make with the house of Israel after those days, says the LORD: I will **put My laws in their mind** and **write them on their hearts**; and I will be their God, and they shall be My people.

Hebrews 10:16 This is the covenant that I will make with them after those days, says the LORD: I will put My laws into their hearts, and in their minds I will write them.

(1) Be familiar with His guidance

- Surrender completely
- Follow the nudging/leading (green light)
- Hold back at the restraint of the Holy Spirit (red light)
- Not sure yet, wait (amber light)



B. The Holy Spirit(2) Live in total dependency on the Holy Spirit

Galatians 5:16, 18, 25 (NIV)

16 So I say, **walk by the Spirit**, and you will not gratify the desires of the flesh.

18 But if you are led by the Spirit, you are not under the law.25 Since we live by the Spirit, let us keep in step with the Spirit.

BOTTOM-LINE Taming Our Tongues
